Celebration Sunday - Building "People" Connections Update - The Lord continues to bless our "Building People Connections" stewardship appeal as our brothers and sisters in Christ have pledged \$768,683 in three year pledges, with \$272,885 received as of August 28, 2020. 189 giving units are participating so far. Our goal is to reduce or eliminate our \$1.2 million dollar building expansion mortgage, thus freeing up funds to enhance our ministry. Thank you to everyone for faithfully keeping up with your pledges, especially in these challenging times. Special gifts in memory of a loved one or in celebration of a special blessing are welcome. Building Connections envelopes are available in the narthex or your envelope packet. Good news – A recent principal payment has lowered our expansion mortgage to \$995,000. Our Celebration Sunday originally planned for March is rescheduled for October 22, 24, and 25th in which we will thank God for the blessings he has poured out upon our expansion program and ministry.

Ministry Structure and Bylaw Update - In 2019 Good Shepherd leaders gathered input from leaders of various areas of ministry and a cross section of our members concerning key areas of ministry to enhance. To enhance member ministry we are considering ways to revise our church structure to increase involvement and ownership from all the members of our church family, male and female, young and old. Our Action Plan includes these goals.

- Initiate a congregation-wide member ministry effort helping God's people discover their strengths and linking them to service.

- Develop a system to train and prepare church leaders and volunteers for service.
- Revise our church structure to increase involvement and ownership from all the members of our church family, male and female, young and old.

We want to remove anything from our Bylaws which hinders member involvement and adopt Bylaws which encourage member involvement. The Coordinating Council has set up six task forces to develop structure for each area of ministry under their responsibility. These include Adult Nurture, Family Nurture, Outreach, School, Support and Worship. Once developed, these will be shared with the congregation at an open forum and eventually our Voters'.

We will also review our ministry staffing needs in response to another Action Plan goal to consider calling a full-time person (pastor or staff minister) whose primary focus is on youth and younger families (ages 18 to 35) giving special encouragement to worship regularly, grow spiritually, and serve joyfully.

Special Thanks – We thank Jerry and Arlene Prochnow for their faithful service on our Altar Committee for so many years, beginning back in the 1970's! 27 times a year this committee prepares the Lord's Supper for us to enjoy.

Memorial Artwork - Good Shepherd has received a memorial to purchase an appropriate artwork for our building addition. The Jerry Henckel family has donated the large piece near the new restrooms. Jerry loved the hymn "Great is Thy Faithfulness," and his family requested a memorial representing this hymn as the theme. The verses were written by Thomas Chisholm, a prolific writer of poetry, who struggled with lifelong health issues. In 1923 he sent his collection of poems to William Runyan, a known musician, who set this poem to music while working for a hymnal publishing company. Runyan stated that after reading the verses, he was struck by the simple beauty of the appeal. He prayed for a tune worthy to carry the message of the poem, based on Lamentations 3:22-23. True to the claims in Lamentations, God was faithful and the beloved hymn was born. A recent recording by Christian artist Chris Rice can be found on the internet.
